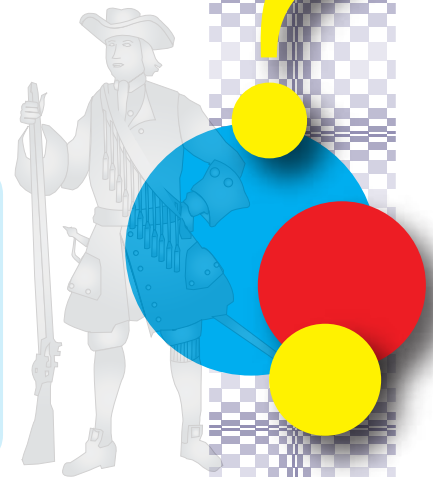
# Fill in the missing words

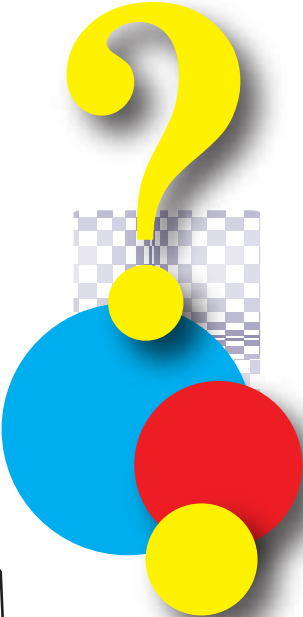
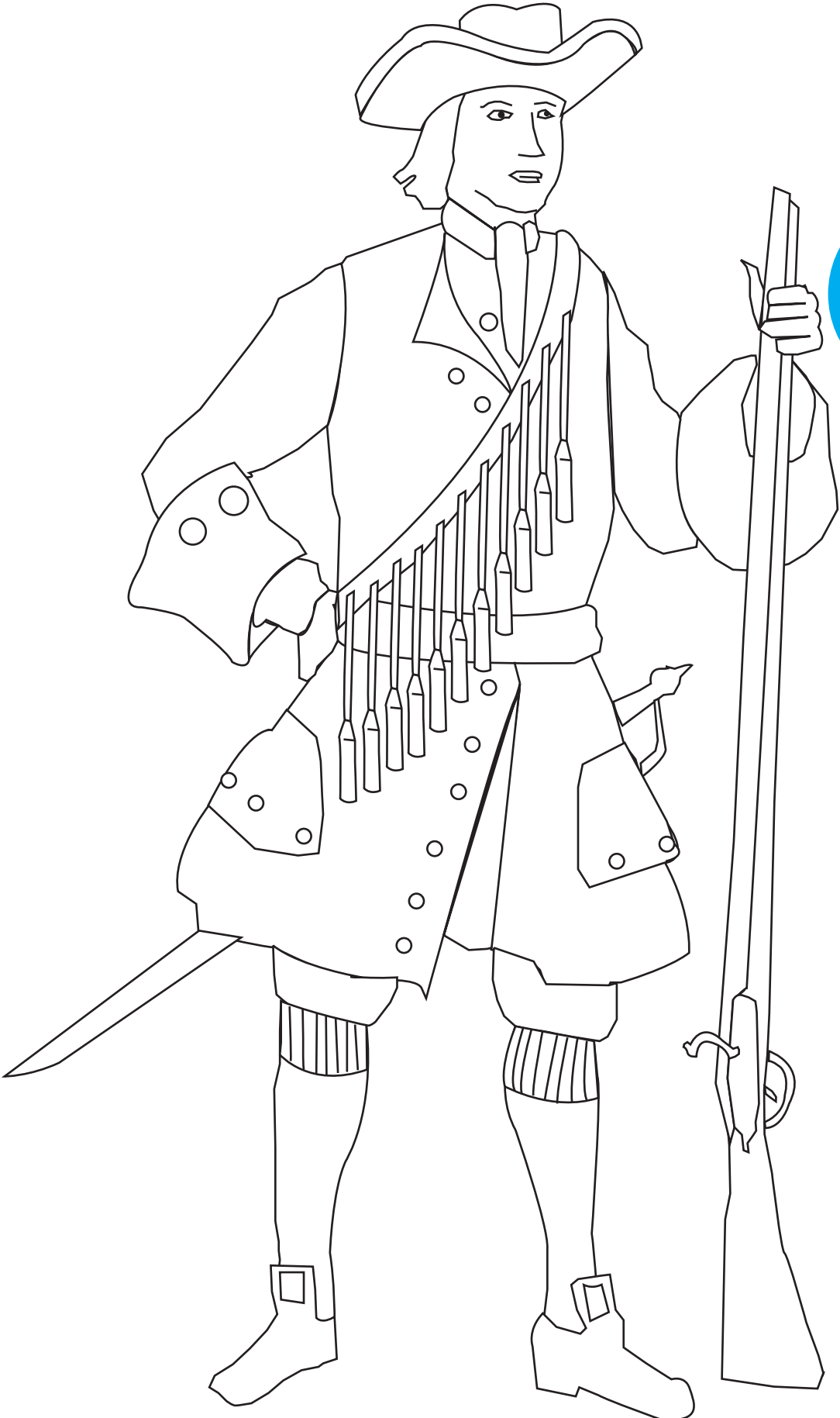
